- Venue and refreshments included.





Frequently asked questions

Who is the network best suited to?

Staff who support future-oriented decisions for the organisation, typically:

- Risk managers
- · Policy officers
- Strategy analysts
- Finance teams
- Legal and compliance advisors
- Planning teams
- Marketing teams
- · Program designers.

How do the sessions work?

Members can suggest a session topic or choose from a library of ideas (at least six weeks in advance). The session will surface members' assumptions about the topic, followed by a presentation of research prepared by the facilitator. A range of workshop tools and techniques will engage members in exploring the implications for different sectors and member organisations. The format of each session may be tailored to the topic.

Do I need to have special knowledge?

No, the only prerequisite is curiosity. With an open mind and an analytical nature, you will get the most from the sessions.

Does the same person need to go each time? What if I can't make it?

You can send a delegate or rotate membership. There are pros and cons for continuity of attendance versus sharing the seat. The topic for each meeting may also be a consideration. If you can't make it, you can still benefit from the session notes online.

How many people from my organisation can be members?

We aim to have a diverse membership of organisations where a range of perspectives can be explored. Therefore, organisations are limited to sending three people to any one session. An imbalance in membership toward one organisation can reduce the benefits of collective intelligence.

Can I still benefit as a member if I don't want to speak in a large group setting?

Our sessions are carefully designed so that everyone can feel comfortable participating in their way. If you have specific requirements, don't hesitate to chat with us so we can help you get the most from your membership.

Can I join online or watch a recording later?
